## GACD's Partnership with Districts

- What is Georgia Association of Conservation Districts (GACD)?
  - GACD is a non-profit association that represents all 40 of Georgia's Conservation Districts.
- What do we do for the Districts?
  - GACD represents, advocates for, and provides a unified voice for all Districts.
  - We offer different initiatives and services the Districts can utilize.



# What are Conservation Districts?

Conservation Districts that are political subdivisions of the State and are governed by elected and appointed District Supervisors.





## **District Functions**

- 1- Develop comprehensive plans for conservation of soil and water resources in the District.
- Promote BMPs such as no till, vegetative plans for stream banks, erosion and sediment control plans, and water conservation methods.
- 2- Work with land owners and developers as well as local, state, and federal governments to implement soil and water conservation measures and practices.
- Maintain partnership with USDA- NRCS, RC&Ds, etc.
- Explain benefits of conservation practices to landowners
- Review erosion and sediment control plans and ensure installation of BMPs on land disturbance sites



### **District Functions**

3-Make machinery and equipment available landowners to help conserve soil and water resources.

4-Conduct surveys, investigations, and research on soil and water parasites. Generate and disseminate information and data on conservation measures.

- Install on-farm demonstration sites
- Promote the importance of Soil Stewardship Week and facilitate distribution of educational and fun material to the community, schools, churches, etc.

5- Conduct demonstrations for soil and water conservation methods.

- Field days, tours, project site visits
- Conservation workshops for youth and teachers



## **District Functions**

- 6- Construct, improve or maintain structures necessary for flood water control & storage.
- Seek funds and local support to maintain watershed dams
- 7- Facilitate and generate financial assistance to landowners, as well as local, state and federal agencies, for soil and water conservation practices.
- Chair and decide upon federal funding priorities through Local Work Group process
- Promote local and federal cost-share programs to landowners
- Be innovative and apply for grants that will further soil and water conservation efforts
- 8- Administer and/or participate in the management of soil and water conservation projects
- Farm Bill Programs (EQIP, WHIP, CRP, etc.)



Feral swine are one of the greatest invasive species challenges facing Georgia with estimated damages of over \$150 million. Feral Swine are reported in all 159 counties.


