

TA2018 (Round 1)




To Date:

Last reports covered April – June 2019

- Over \$7 million spent
- Grantees reported spending \$2.7 million in match (28%)
- Over 230 staff distributed across 300 districts – 63% Full Time

- Announced Fall 2017
- Funds distributed to 157 grantees in 2018
 - \$7.54 million EQIP
 - \$1.46 million COTA
 - Requires grantees to supply 20% match






TA2019 (Round 2)



- **Grant Recipients 2018 and 2019**
- 112 of the grantees also received a TA2018 grant
- Requires grantees to supply 20% match

- Funds distributed to 168 grantees in 2019
 - \$3.70 million EQIP
 - \$3.05 million CSP
 - \$3.15 million COTA





TA2018 (Round 1) Status

- Over 40% of the grants are now closed
- 94% of the grantees are in reporting compliance
- 40% of grantees are not on track to close their grants by December 1, based on June 2019 reporting



- Grant-Supported Staff has worked over 260,000 hours 125 FTE
- Assisted with over 15,000 EQIP Agreements
 - About 10% with Historical Underserved Populations
- Completed over 6,800 COTA Plans

- Vermont Association of Conservation Districts
 - The Cartographic/Land Treatment Planning Technician works on elements of Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plans
 - A Program Assistant assists with the processing of EQIP applications
 - A Conservation Activity Plan (CAP) Contracting Technician assists in the development and design of CAP 106 (Forest Management Plan) applications and contracts
- Morris County Soil Conservation District, NJ
 - Hired an Ag. Conservation Specialist to assist NRCS
 - manages EQIP contracts, responds to Requests for Assistance, CREP contract inspections and report writing and Highly Erodible Land Determinations

- Blount County Conservation District, TN
 - hired a Watershed Coordinator to assist multiple county and municipality entities in developing stormwater protocols and other watershed-based improvement projects.
 - Also developed environmental education curricula for various school groups
 - Tasks completed include outreach to potential EQIP applicants as well as the development of an ecological planting plan for a 16 acre outdoor learning area at a local elementary school
- Fleming County Conservation District, KY
 - Hired an **Technician** to work on EQIP contracts across multiple counties
 - Work consisted on farm visits, talking with the landowners, talking with NRCS personnel about what was possibly keeping the landowner from accomplishing the contract goals

- Clark County Soil and Water Conservation District, IA
 - hired a Soil Technician
 - helping our federal Soil Conservationist do EQIP rankings and contacting producers and estimating for pending applications.
 - laid out terrace projects and went out to the field to certify completion of projects
- Allen County Soil and Water Conservation District, IN
 - Hired a local grower as a Conservation Programs Specialist to assist cooperators to follow up on applied practices and promoted other conservation practices
 - The Specialist has provided strategies on soil health, cover crops and no till practices to the other growers.
 - His contacts have given the opportunity for increased Amish outreach leading to dialog with these historically underserved producers promoting available programs.



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- Arkansas RC&D Council
 - Hired a EQIP Program Analyst to provide a much-needed analytical assessment of EQIP contracts filed with the State NRCS office for the purpose of more effective allocations of funds
- Sebastian and Crawford Soil and Water Conservation Districts, AR
 - Hired a Urban Assistant to assist with the production of various partnered gardens and evolve into an urban conservation program
 - Developed gardens that help the undeserved people of the counties with the production of fresh produce
 - Spotlighted the help available thru NRCS with the EQIP programs to help with their urban operations
- Texas State Soil & Water Board
 - Hired five **Technicians** to assist local conservationists with their work load.
 - helping NRCS develop and implement conservation plans and practices, manage workload at the office, and participate in local landowner educational programs and local work group meetings



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- Triangle/Chino Winds Natural Resource Conservation District, AZ
 - Hired a full time **Archeologist** as a cultural resource specialist
 - Were able to address backlogged cultural resource clearances and expand to other cultural resource concerns.
- Big Thompson Conservation District, CO
 - Hiring a staff Forester has created additional programs for landowners and enhance our visibility.
 - Contractors have been able to utilize the materials coming off of the forest mitigation projects for retail firewood, fencing, dimensional lumber and bedding
 - This investment from NACD along with USDA and NRCS, of \$75,000 has a leveraged total economic impact of nearly \$7,000,000 into the local economy
- Nevada Association of Conservation Districts
 - Using retired NRCS staff as Contractors
 - Assisting seven Nevada CDs to complete Resource Needs Assessments (RNA)



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- Amador Resource Conservation District, CA
 - Staff Forester is shared across multiple counties.
 - Addressed an 18 to 24 month backlog of over 80 landowners requesting assistance.
 - First ever district employee
 - By the end of TA2018, they were able to leverage TA2019 with other funding to hire a second employee
- Humboldt County Resource Conservation District, CA
 - Tried to hire an engineer, not successful, requested proposals for a Contract Engineer
 - Hired a local engineering firm for site visits, survey work, designs, construction management and inspections




Northern Plains

- Blackfeet Natural Resource Conservation District, MT
 - Hired a **Planner** to collect data for analysis of conservation projects on and off the reservation to increase participation on the reservation
 - Created and surveyed members on agricultural and water planning issues to gauge public input
- North Dakota Conservation District Employees Association
 - Hired a part time **District Manager**
 - Grant is being utilized to provide training in areas of Farm Bill Conservation Programs
 - Development of a conservation deliverable tracking system that streamlines employee progress for reporting
